

INFORMATION ABOUT RE-OPENING SAINT SOPHIA CATHEDRAL

Dear Parishioners,

Despite the distance between us, during these past few months, it's been a real blessing to see how our beloved Saint Sophia community has managed to express their deep and sincere care and Love for one another and remain so very close and connected, all the while, longing for the day when we can, together as family, return to the Cathedral.

During the past couple of weeks there has been various messages, reported in the media, that has heightened our anticipation, though much of that messaging reported news related to areas outside of Los Angeles. Finally, on May 26th, LA County and the City of Los Angeles announced that Churches will be able to reopen their doors to their congregations, though under strict guidelines and regulations from the health department.

Saint Sophia, intending to comply with guidelines as set forth by the State of California, LA County, the City of LA, as well as the Greek Orthodox Metropolis of San Francisco, is grateful for the opportunity to reopen our doors beginning Sunday, May 31, 2020. **The Huffington Center will remain closed.**

We all recognize that there are still difficult days ahead of us and much to be concerned about, which is why we appreciate the patience, understanding and committed efforts of our entire community, to insure that each of us is made to feel safe, healthy and comfortable during this transitional period as we gradually reopen the Cathedral. During the initial phase

of the Cathedral's reopening, like much of our society, that which we were once familiar with will be noticeably different.

We will continue to LiveStream the services on our Saint Sophia Facebook page. You do not need to have a Facebook account to watch it online.

The following guidelines and regulations, that we must comply with, are for the health and safety of all. Thank you.

- Upon arrival at Saint Sophia, everyone must check in before entering the Cathedral, by providing their name and phone number at a welcoming table.
- Face masks are required. (No masks for children under the age of 2 and parental supervision required for children 3-8)
- The LA County, Department of Health has limited our attendance in the Cathedral to no more than 100 people.
- Be assured, the Cathedral and public restrooms have been sanitized before reopening and will be sanitized after every service.
- Anyone who is sick, has been sick or has been around someone who has been sick or who has traveled outside of the state during the past 2 weeks, as well as anyone who is exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19, or who have family members who are ill, should stay home.
- The Greek Orthodox Metropolis of San Francisco has emphasized that "Parishioners who are at higher risk for severe illness from COVID-19 (65 years or older, who have underlying medical conditions, been exposed to the

- virus or who are experiencing symptoms) are strongly encouraged to refrain from attending services.
- Congregants/visitors will be temperature screened, with non-contact (without touching) thermometers upon arrival as we are required to conduct these non-contact temperature checks by the Health Department.
- We must, respectfully, maintain physical, social, distancing of six feet or more between congregants/visitors from different households when standing or seated in the Cathedral.
- When receiving the Sacrament of Holy Communion we ask that you tilt your head back and not place your lips on the communion spoon.
- Saint Sophia will have hand sanitizer available to use upon arrival and throughout your visit.

As we've all noticed, the information that we receive from the health department and government jurisdictions changes quickly and often. The Saint Sophia Parish Council will continue to monitor the situation and will provide updates to you as they become available. To be sure that we are reaching as many members of our community as possible, please be sure to share this information with one another.



Thank you to all who participated in 2019. We collected and assembled 134 boxes last year. 2019 was one of our most successful years to date. This year's goal is to fill 300 boxes. Every month, between January and October, all parishioners will have the opportunity to make donations to help us meet this goal.

Our March focus is on handmade items for boys and girls. If you have not yet checked out the Saint Sophia Craft group, this is a good time to stay after church and lend a hand. The group is looking to make the following:

- 100 coloring story books with stick/finger puppet sets for the 2-4 year-olds.**

- 200 friendship bracelets for the 5-14 year-olds**
- 300 handmade jigsaw puzzles for all ages**

The new normal will probably be wearing 'face masks' when we are out in public to protect ourselves and each other. Hand sanitizers should be with us at all times.




